PROJECT PURPOSE

- To address social determinants of health through the development of social capital via mentorship for Jemez youth
 - To broaden knowledge base and skillset for Jemez Youth
 - To be better equipped to maximize their secondary educational experience for entry into an allied health career
- To be better equipped in their pursuit of a higher education and career
 - Concurrently, Jemez will empower Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine (BCOM) medical students with a sense of community and belonging that they are a part of the greater New Mexican culture
- In turn, medical students are going to have an internal connection to want to stay and practice medicine at Jemez Health & Human Services or elsewhere in rural New Mexico
 - This intrinsic bond will address the current challenge of retaining allied health workers in tribal communities and New Mexico
- Overall, this summer camp is the first step in developing, retaining and recruiting allied health professionals within the Pueblo of Jemez and from BCOM
